Lobby Renovation Project Update

We are more than half way through with the Lobby Renovation Project and are tracking for completion in April 2020. Starting December 2019, we will begin the removal of the scaffolding found in the corridors and elevator lobbies currently found on the 1st floor. At that time, the corridor ceilings and new light fixture installation will be finished. We all look forward to the completion of this first phase of construction, as the constrictions on access currently found on the 1st floor corridors will significantly improve.

Once the scaffolding has been removed, we will begin the installation of wall and floor finishes in several phases over several weeks starting in January 2020. Construction continues in the back of the house where the new Lobby, Conference Center and Exterior Courtyard will be located as well as the new Lobby Entry. Temporary walls will be erected once the scaffolding is removed to restrict access to these areas until the project is completed.

We continue to thank you for your patience and understanding during this construction period but we are excited to share the final results with you in the coming year.

We are upgrading the energy efficiency and environmental impact of our building's lighting by replacing over twelve thousand existing fluorescent lights with LED lights. The energy usage will reduce approximately 598,041 kWh, which is a 51 % reduction in energy use. Considering our cost per kWh, that amounts to approximately \$107,647 lower energy cost per year. The LED lights have triple the life of the fluorescent lights which greatly reduces the demand on building staff to replace burned out lighting and the need for the purchase of replacement lighting in the future. The LED lights have no hazardous waste, which on a broad scale can have a powerful, positive impact on the environment.

We contracted with United Energy Strategies to develop and implement the project, which encompassed a building audit; specifications and testing of the LED lights; development of an Opportunity Report; securing approval to proceed from the LADWP; supplying all products, arranging and managing installation; and handling post-installation LADWP requirements to qualify the project for rebates. The expected utility rebate is \$127,369.

Installation is expected to commence in late December 2019 with expected completion within thirty business days. The installation will be scheduled for after-hours work, to avoid disruption to tenants. It is generally acknowledged that LED lights provide better quality light for tenants. The reduced energy and maintenance cost will directly benefit tenants by lowering the operating costs of the building. Tripling the life of the lighting will also greatly reduce the incidents and inconvenience to tenants of lights burning out and then requiring building maintenance to replace the lighting.

This is a win-win for the building, for our tenants, for the environment, and for the sustainability of our energy supply.

URM, with the help of volunteers, served a Thanksgiving meal to thousands of men, women and families experiencing homelessness on Skid Row on Wednesday, November 27th.

Watt Plaza made a nominal donation to the Union Rescue Mission.



December:

Watt Plaza Partned with the *Building Owners and Association of Greater Los Angeles (BOMA/GLA)* for their 30th annual "Holiday Toy, Food and Clothing Drive" in which we were able to collect (7) 40 gallon bags of various needed items.
